



We wanted to be able to showcase our local community to the National attendees and pushed to have the dates coincide with the San Jose Obon Festival to share this overwhelming local cultural experience! Of course, San Jose Taiko performed, this time at the City Hall Rotunda Welcome Reception, and at the reception new JA City Manager Ed Shikada joined San Jose native son Norman Mineta in welcoming the conventioneers. Then myself as another native welcomed the guests to the historic Le Petit Trianon Theatre where we were treated to the Luis Valdez Valley of the Heart staged reading that showed the rich history of immigrants in our valley.

SJ Taiko founders Roy and PJ Hirabayashi held a fantastic workshop and also received a JA of the Biennium Award after being nominated by Chapter members! We developed a Youth Plenary about when racism crosses the line in the minds of JACL members of various ages and I heard that this plenary will become the genesis of many future conversations. We toured the boosters to San Jose highlights including the SJSU Assembly Center site at Uchida Hall and a walking tour of Japantown. And we even entertained with a concert by the renowned band Hiroshima.

Although these are annual business conventions, the local committee provided a lot of value added to make the experience more enjoyable and culturally relevant. #### Letter from Marsha Aizumi

## Marsha Aizumi



An Educational Consultant and Speaker, the Author of 'Two Spirits, One Heart' and recipient of the 2014 JACL Biennium Award at the recent National Convention.

Here is her letter to SJJACL....



"Dear San Jose JACL Chapter:

First of all, I want to thank your chapter for being the host city for the 2014 JACL National Convention. It was my first JACL experience and it was an amazing 4 days. But amazing experiences don't just happen. It takes dedicated and hardworking individuals to create such an incredible event.

And so on behalf of the Aizumi Family I want to thank each of you for all you did to make this convention so

memorable for us.

If you attended the convention, you know that I received the 2014 JACL Biennium Award for my work for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (LGBTQ) families. I have a passion for this social justice issue, because of my transgender son. Aiden was born female. He transitioned to be male after almost 10 years of struggling as a family to stay connected as our child became withdrawn, depressed, agoraphobic and later we would discover suicidal. Our book, Two Spirits, One Heart chronicles our painful, yet remarkable journey of moving to unconditional love and acceptance.

Coming to convention and receiving this award meant that JACL was not only recognizing the importance of my work, but the importance of supporting LGBTQ families within their chapters and in their communities. Shame, sadness and fear kept my voice silent for a time. I was afraid of losing all that I loved. But seeing a convention that was created by San Jose and others, I walked away optimistic for the future of API LGBTQ families. Your voices, your words and your actions matter so much to families like mine. They provide a sense of acceptance and support which in the end give families hope. And hope is everything . . . . "

Over several days in mid-April, the **Santo Market** wall facing Sixth Street was transformed from a pastel patchwork covering old graffiti into a traffic-stopping mural featuring a wave and a rising red-orange sun. The design took its inspiration from The Great Wave off Kanagawa, the famous masterpiece created by **Katsushika Hokusai** in the Edo period. It embodied Mark Santo's vision of water and sun, and the mural artist, John Barrick, has the classic woodblock print hanging in his studio.

Hibiscus flowers and more waves were recently added to extend the mural, a nod to the tropical flavor of the store, which has carried a variety of Hawaii products for 15 years, and recently introduced poke bowls. The motifs of the mural fit Santo Market, which has become a Japantown institution since opening in 1946 on Jackson Street, and has been at its current location at Sixth and Taylor since 1957.

Besides the mural at Santo Market, there were three others that were painted in April around Japantown as part of the Live Mural Project, which came to fruition through connections that crisscross the extent of Japantown. Carlos Araujo of Empire Seven Studios did much of the legwork and coordination. He selected John Barrick from his network of artists for this mural because of his love of traditional murals and background in lettering and painting signs. Tamiko Rast of Roy's Station and the web design firm Rasteroids connected Santo Market with the project.



Barrick co-owns a studio and gallery, The Cannery, which is three blocks away from the market, next to Gordon Biersch. His work can be seen on other murals and on hand painted, handmade signs around Japantown, including Cukui and Headliners.

Both Mark Santo and John Barrick expressed appreciation for this collaboration. Barrick said that he hopes the Live Mural Project contributes to the community and exposes people to art, much like the vibrant public art scenes in Los Angeles and San Francisco.

They were treated to an amazing set of workshops, participated in tours of local venues, and joined locals in a round of golf. Over the weekend, many conventioneers attended the fabulous **San Jose Obon festival**.

The Convention Hotel, the DoubleTree, prepared sumptuous meals that were excellent. The National JACL recognized very special individuals for their outstanding contributions to the Nikkei community including our own **Roy and PJ Hirabayashi** as Japanese Americans of the Biennium and **Lawson Sakai** JACLer of the Biennium.

It was gratifying to see that 60 youths were involved in the Convention. Another 20 participated in a portion of the Convention through an internship program and others attended the Youth Welcome Mixer that was highlighted by the popular **DJ**, *Squareweezy*. The Youths influence extended to general plenary sessions on the use of social media and an interactive session on racial comedy.

The level of local support in hosting the Convention was fantastic. A core group planned the event over the course of one year and included members from the San Jose, West Valley, Gilroy, and Monterey JACL Chapters. The number of volunteers swelled to more than 120 during the Convention itself, with individuals coming from throughout the Nikkei community. The success of the 45th JACL National Convention was directly attributable to the collective efforts of the volunteers listed on Page 1 and 11 of this newsletter.


# How Third Thursday Fun raiser started - By James 'Aki' Matsumoto


# Heart Mountain Wyoming Foundation's Annual Pilgrimage—by Hanna Maruyama


