2014 Yu-Ai Kai Mochitsuki: by Christy Chung

On Saturday, December 13, 2014, the San Jose Buddhist Church annex buzzed with the spirited activity of Yu-Ai Kai's annual mochitsuki. In total, nearly 1,800 pounds of mochi was steamed, pounded, cut, shaped, flipped for cooling, and packaged. This was accomplished with the help of 228 volunteers from the community and local high schools. It was one of the best turnouts in over 35 years.




The community groups included: CYS, BSA Troop 611, Junior YBA, BWA, San Jose JACL, Silicon Valley JACL, Wesley UMC, Girl Scout Troop 61302 (Buddhist).

The high schools included: Cupertino JNHS, Homestead JNHS, Archbishop Mitty HS, Lynbrook JNHS; Piedmont Hills HS Leo Club, Yerba Buena HS Interact, and Silver Creek HS.

The mochi was sold for \$4 per pound, with all proceeds benefiting Yu-Ai Kai's programs and services for seniors.

Mochitsuki, or mochi-pounding ceremony, is a Japanese tradition that brings people together to prepare for celebrating the New Year. Mochi is one of the most important foods eaten on New Year's Day, and symbolizes longevity,

San Jose State University Re-dedicates Yoshihiro Uchida Hall by Tom Oshidari

On November 7th after a multi-million dollar renovation, the building on the San Jose State University (SJSU) campus originally built in 1929-30 and called the Men's Gymnasium, then in 1997 renamed **Yoshihiro Uchida Hall** (aka YUH), was re-dedicated in a ceremony honoring the man whose name the building bears. Included in the ceremony was the unveiling of a plaque to adorn the building noting its history as a processing center for Santa Clara County Japanese Americans and Japanese resident aliens during WWII. Included among those honoring Mr. Uchida were SJSU President, **Mohammad Qayoumi**, who presented the Presidential Medal of Distinction, the University's highest award; Consul General of Japan, **Masato Watanabe**; San Jose City Mayor-Elect, **Sam Liccardo**; and the Honorable **Norman Mineta**.

A long-time San Jose Japantown supporter and San Jose JACL Advisory Council member,



the now 94 year old honoree began his history with the University in 1940 when he enrolled as a student majoring in chemical engineering. While enrolled he competed on the wrestling team and coached police students in judo. His student status was interrupted by WWII when he was drafted into the Army where he served as a medical technician. ---After the War he re-enrolled to complete his studies with a degree in biological sciences in 1947. He continued to teach judo and was instrumental in creating an on campus judo program as well as creating a weight class system and rules that led to judo being accepted as an amateur competitive sport and eventually an Olympic sport. Yosh Uchida has led the SJSU judo team to unprecedented success—having won 45 National collegiate championships. Also, along the way Yosh Uchida has received the SJSU Tower Award; was

inducted into the SJSU Hall of Fame in 1992; and was inducted into the SJSU Legends Hall of Fame in 2012.

The new facility contains a 1200-seat gym, training and therapy rooms, a weight room, offices, classrooms, and, of course, a judo dojo.

The portrait by which Yosh is seen in the photo was painted by **Dr. Andor Paposi-Jobb**, a retired Professor of Fine Arts at Clarion University of Pennsylvania, who not only taught Master's Classes in Portrait Painting but also had founded the Hun-Judo Dojo at the University and was its Sensei. Upon retiring and having some time on his hands, Dr. Paposi-Jobb decided to honor the sport of judo by painting portraits of those he considered to be judo greats, and, of course, Yosh Uchida was among those he chose to honor.

"Looking for Jiro Onuma: Queer Perspectives on Wartime Incarceration" by Marge Tsuji

In celebration of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender History Month (LGBT History Month), the San Jose JACL hosted this program, at the IMB hall.

On October 19th, the San Jose JACL sponsored a presentation by **Dr. Tina Takemoto** on the above topic in support of the National JACL's recognition of gay rights and October being LGBT History Month.

Dr. Takemoto is an artist and associate professor of visual studies at California College of the Arts in San Francisco. Based on her work examining issues of queer identity, race, memory and grief, Dr. Takemoto has received several art grants and her articles have appeared in many journals. She is the board president of the Queer Cultural Center and co-founder of Queer Conversations on Culture and the Arts.

"Looking for Jiro Onuma" recounts Dr. Takemoto's archival research to explore the hidden dimensions of same-sex intimacy and queer sexuality in Japanese Americans while incarcerated during World War II. Sending out a

call for any information on the topic, Dr. Takemoto was unable to elicit any such information. People scoffed at the idea of Japanese Americans being gay, and especially in the confines of the crowded camps. Yet, Dr. Takemoto persevered and pieced together part of the difficult life someone like Onuma must have led to both hide and express his sexuality. "Looking for Jiro Onuma" received Best Experimental Film Jury Award at the Austin LGBT International Film Festival.

A second documentary that Dr. Takemoto showed was "Sex, Politics and Sticky Rice", a film that is still in its working stage. It features five Asian American lesbians speaking very frankly about their search for love and their activist work in the San Francisco Bay Area since the 1980's. It was shocking, and yet refreshing, to hear their voices; their fears, their grieves, their desires – framed in a lesbian lifestyle, yet the same fears, grieves and search for love that all women feel regardless of gender identity.

Dr. Takemoto's two films and her narrative were enjoyed by about 25 mixed-age and mixed-gender audience. Her films were professional in quality, informative, and amazingly creative. She is a vivacious and enthusiastic speaker, very knowledgeable and with a delightful sense of humor. Her presentation was extremely well-received and there were many questions after her talk. An interesting sideline was that someone in the audience had been an 8-year-old boy living in the same barracks as Jiro at Topaz.


